Why Community Youth Advisory Board?

How to establish Community Youth Advisory Board?

Inclusive Representation and Selection

- Reach out to youth with diverse backgrounds, experiences and perspectives on mental health policy making
- Ensure a transparent selection process and ask for advice from different stakeholders

Community Engagement and Advocacy

- Organize community events and campaigns directed by youth representatives to raise awareness on mental health in collaboration with local organizations
- Offer youth opportunities to interact directly with community members and policy makers

Empowerment and Sustainability

- Provide training to empower youth representatives with advocacy and leadership skills and celebrate their achievement
- Develop a sustainable plan to absorb new members and for future collaboration



How to ensure the inclusivity of Community Youth Advisory Board?

Creating a Respectful Environment

- Provide training to youth representatives on diversity, equity, and inclusivity
- Establish rules that value active listening and respectful dialogues

Accessible Resources and Feedback

- Provide materials that are accessible for everyone and organize meetings to discuss the resources
- Seek feedback from youth representatives and community members to improve strategies and initiatives

Supportive and Equal Relationship

- Establish a support team to assist minority youth and make sure their voices are heard and understood
- Schedule regular one-on-one meetings to address concerns from every member
